Chelan County Fire District #3 Levy Discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Kelly O'Brien presented information regarding the upcoming levy for Fire District #3. The district is asking voters to approve an increase in the levy rate from \$0.35/\$1,000 to \$1.00/\$1,000.
Patient Centered Medical Home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Dr. Jonathan Sugarman and Gwen Cox from Qualis Health shared what it means to be a Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) and reviewed the initial assessment scores for Cascade Medical.
Q&A with Dr. Jerome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Things are going well in the clinic. There has been some turnover this year, including with providers. The local providers with families feel they take on some additional duties at times. ▪ Kathleen's leadership has been very positive. ▪ Limitations in the clinic – time is a barrier. Communication with patients is tough. Providers need better ways to communicate with patients and be able to provide better education including links to websites, etc. ▪ Staggering work times for staff will help build stability. ▪ Dr. Jerome recently spoke to Rotary about the Opioid dilemma. ▪ We need to build team based care for patients with chronic pain, diabetes and all chronic conditions. ▪ Providers are excited to have Dr. Maxwell Moholy joining us as a Behavioral Health Consultant in September. ▪ The need for behavioral health integration in the clinic is huge. ▪ Providers wish the Board knew how hard staffing can be, including filling holes on the schedule. ▪ Dr. Jerome feels it would be beneficial to have a provider retreat day with a set agenda to close the loop on process improvements. ▪ As a group we do a good job of focusing on the patients.
